- Past and current projects/papers you worked on or are currently working on
- Future projects you plan
- Potential cooperation with other groups of the SFB
- Is there any potential overlap with other groups in the SFB?

As the group is smaller than we initially expected, we would like to have a discussion exchange of your experiences, suggestions, and lessons learned during your PhD. As we are at different stages in our PhDs, we hope to have some valuable experiences exchanged.

So please also think about and come up with a few concrete examples of your PhD or, if you are in an early phase of your PhD, also of your Master studies:

- How did you structure your PhD project?
- What plans during your PhD did work out as you anticipated?
- What plans did not work out? Is there a particular reason they did not work out?
- How do you come up with new ideas for future publications?
- Did you have a stay abroad?
 - How did you organize that?
 - o How did you get in contact with the university abroad?
 - How did the SFB finance/support in your research stay

In the evenings and during the discussion time slots, we also have the opportunity to discuss current ongoing projects with the others.
